As was authorized by the Presbytery assembled on August 15, 2024, the transfer of the former Trinity Presbyterian Church (Birmingham) property from Whitlock Investment Company to The Vine Church closed on September 26, 2024.

#### **For Action**

## . First Presbyterian Church, Auburn, Alabama.

First Presbyterian Church (Auburn) (the "Church") has requested that the Presbytery of Sheppards and Lapsley (the "Presbytery") consent to the Church's application for, and closing of, a loan (the "Loan") from the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) Investment and Loan Program, Inc. (the "Lender"). The Church's session recently approved the Loan and will present the Loan to the Church's congregation for approval. The Loan will be in the principal amount of \$250,000 with a payment term of ten years and will be secured by a mortgage on the Church's property. The Loan proceeds, along with \$30,000 designated by the Church from its capital replacement fund, will be used to address water intrusion issue, including multiple active leaks and the damage they have caused to the interior of the church. The sanctuary roof will be replaced and gutter systems on two different buildings will be repaired. The interior damage to the walls will be replastered and re-painted. The estimated total project cost is \$280,000. As is standard practice, the Presbytery's required to guarantee repayment of loans made by the Lender to the Presbytery's member churches.

The trustees recommend and move as follows:

**RESOLVED**, the First Presbyterian Church of Auburn, Alabama ("**Church**"), located at 143 E. Thatch Ave., Auburn, Alabama 36830, has applied for a loan as follows from the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) Investment and Loan Program, Inc. ("Lender"): Amount of Loan: \$250,000.00

**FURTHER RESOLVED,** The Presbytery of Sheppards and Lapsley, Incorporated, an Alabama nonprofit corporation, ("**Presbytery**") having received and reviewed the Loan application of the Church, a member in good standing of this Presbytery, approves the Loan application, and guarantees the repayment of principal and interest on the loan to the Lender as described above. The officers of the Presbytery are authorized to sign a guarantee and any and all documents of this loan as authorized agents of the Presbytery.

In support of this motion, the Trustees submit the Loan Application provided by the Church. (Appendix E-19) Approved

B. Property of former Center Point Presbyterian Church (Birmingham). Background. After the closure of Center Point Presbyterian Church, on March 10, 2021, the property was leased to The Family Worship Center (Pastor Bruce Carpenter) for \$1,000 per month for a term of three years, with an option to purchase the property for \$200,000. Half of the monthly rent was to be credited toward the purchase of the property if the purchase option were exercised. The lease expired by its own terms in March 2024 without the purchase option having been exercised. The Trustees then negotiated as of March 15, 2024, a new lease with The Family Worship Center with rent of \$500 per month, with no option to purchase. On July 5, 2024, the Trustees, acting for the Presbytery, entered into a listing agreement with Tammy Johnson of Commercial Realty Partners, LLC, for the sale of the property. The listing price for the property was \$525,000. Meanwhile, The Family Worship Center began to make improvements to the property, mainly for the purpose of adding the ministry of a day care program for children. The Trustees had the entire property surveyed, which amounts to approximately ten acres. Tammy Johnson marketed the property on three extensive commercial real estate databases and email distribution services. Hundreds of subscribers opened the brochure page describing the property. A large "for sale" sign was erected on the property, which faces Center Point Parkway, a busy thoroughfare. Ms. Johnson also contacted the self-storage business adjacent to the property to ascertain any interest they might have in purchasing the property and expanding their self-storage business. The only offer that has been received for the property comes from Rev. Carpenter, who is offering \$300,000 cash, contingent on obtaining commercial bank financing. The trustees recommend a counter-offer for \$350,000 and, if the counter-offer is rejected, a sale of the property to Rev. Carpenter (or his assigns) for \$300,000, less closing expenses. A copy of the latest version of the real estate sales contract ("Contract") for the property is attached to this report for reference.

Action. The Trustees recommend that the Presbytery authorize the appropriate officers of the Presbytery to execute and deliver the Contract for any purchase price equal to or greater than \$300,000, less closing expenses, and, assuming all conditions of the Contract have been met, to proceed with the closing of the sale of the property.
